The High Holy Days

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The Fall Feasts are:

- 1. Feast of Trumpets, aka, Rosh Hashanah. Our Warrior King.
- 2. Feast of Atonement, aka, Yom Kippur. Our High Priest.
- 3. Feast of Tabernacles, aka, --- Sukkot. Our God is With Us.

There are seven Feasts. The other four are as follows:

The Spring Feasts are:

Passover, Lamb of God

Unleavened Bread. Bread of Life

First Fruits. The Resurrected One

The Feast of Summer:

Pentecost. Holy Spirit Power.

For this study we will look at the Fall Feasts and why it is still important to know this section of God's Word. The Lord declared to Moses that these "remembrances" should stand as a lasting ordinance.

 In the Feast of Trumpets, we see how we are called to be AWAKE, ALERT, and ready to discard any and all lies of the enemy. WE are called to be watchmen who discern the times and season. We are called to be men of women of Divine wisdom who hold God's standards in our generation. We are called to be WARRIORS.

- 2. In the Day of Atonement, we honor Jesus Christ as our Great High Priest who 'went through the veil' and opened up the Holy of Holies for us. We press in to the fact that in His royal priesthood He has once and for all made a sacrifice for sin. He has now said that we are 'royalty' with Him. We will examine the details of the Old Testament Day of Atonement and observe how the finished work of Christ "gives us everything pertaining to life and godliness".
- 3. In the Feast of Tabernacles we celebrate Jesus Christ, Immanuel, God with Us. We will review how the Lord instructed the Israelites to dwell in tents, to remember the promise He gave to Abraham, and to remember that earth is not our home. In the New Testament, Jesus Christ chose the timing of this Feast to declare to all those gathered in Jerusalem that all those who believed would have streams of water flowing out of them. (John 7). As the Israelites went down to the pool of Siloam, which means the One Sent, Jesus declared, I AM the One sent!
